- Birth: Rosa Louise McCauley February 4th, 1913 Tuskegee, Alabama, U.S

- Known for: Montgomery bus Boycott

- Died: October 24th, 2005

Montgomery bus boycott

On December 1st, 1955, Montgomery, Alabama, U.S.

Under the system the system of segregation used on Montgomery buses, the ten front seats were reserved for white people at all times. The ten back seats were supposed to be reserved for black people at all times. The middle section of the bus consisted of sixteen unreserved seats for white and black people on a segregated basis. White people filled the middle seats from the front to back, and black people filled the seats from back to front until the bus was full. If other black people boarded the bus, then they were required to stand. If another white person boarded the bus, then every one in the black row nearest the front had to get up and stand so a new row for white people could be created, it was illegal for white and black people to sit next to each other. When Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat for a white person, she was sitting in the first row of the middle section.
